# The A-B-F-S Christ C are G roup

Three of the four couples in the ABFS group (Paul & Dolores Anderson, Curt & Kathy Fellers and Larry & Fran Stockert) were part of a BASIC group that started in 1990-91. Both Dolores & were trained for leadership. For several years the group was in flux; members came and went. Consequently the group never developed the cohesiveness that was enjoyed by groups. When Pr. introduced the Christ Care model, she and others persuaded Larry & Fran to return to the group and recruited Larry to take the ChristCare leadership training. Pr. Becca added two more couples: Ron & Judy Baker and John and Mary Kmet.



That was about six years ago. With the Christ Care Covenant, and Larry's gentle leadership, the five couples did evolve into an effective group. It took time. All of us were busy people. The commitment to the covenant we had made with each other made the

difference. The first year or two were awkward as we tried to develop a rhythm and come to grips with our expectations for the group. What we discovered was that all of us were already active in the church and already knew how to meet our spiritual educational needs. What we were really looking for were Christian friends with whom to share the journey. We gained more by just talking through our life events than by actively pursuing study programs. We did spend about a year viewing and discussing the videos on the Holy Land; we went to spirituallythemed movies several times and enjoyed lively post-movie discussions. One year we spent time reviewing books and tapes speculating about post-death experiences and discussing among ourselves the mystery of death and resurrection.

All of us agreed that service was an important component of a spiritually healthy life, so from the beginning of the Christ Care covenant we participated annually in the Adopt-a-Family program. For several years we took responsibility for care of the outdoor chapel area. Last year we planned an Empty Nesters program. But by far most of the 'service' has been to one another. It has been a very eventful six years for us. Our group has experienced most of life's top stressors: loss of parents and siblings, serious personal illness, marriages of children and children moving away, births of grandchildren, and challenging changes of residence. It is these occasions where

Christ Care is most meaningful. We have rejoiced and mourned with one another. Perhaps the most meaningful moment of our Christ Care meetings is the end, when we hold hands in a circle and spontaneously pray for one another and our families, for our church, for our friends in our extended church family, always closing with the Lord's Prayer (the King James version!). Eyes become moist: and our commitment to a short meeting evaporates as departing seems to take longer and longer. This year we have committed to meeting every other week instead of twice a month. We think it will be easier to remember and we will work in a few extra meetings over the course of the year.

But—it's not all meetings and service. Much—maybe most—is eating and fun. Over the years we have taken part in a murder mystery train ride, bicycled on the bike trail, attended a season of Wright State University plays, and this past Labor Day weekend most of us traveled Chicago to for Anderson's wedding. Our Christmas season begins with Wright State's Madrigal Dinner and we prepare for Easter by sitting together weekly at the Lenten soup suppers and services. And in between we try to eat out several times a year, trying new places (Yankee Trace & Grand Finale) and returning to old favorites (Thirsty Dog).

This summer John & Mary moved to Cleveland—but we still consider them ad hoc members. Fellers have visited them twice; and we're hoping for a group meeting in Cleveland soon. This year Ron Baker is serving as liaison for the group, succeeding John, who succeeded Larry; but in reality this group neither leads nor follows anyone. We are a group of Epiphany Christians who have come to love one another. We

think that is what Christ Care is all about.
